Policy: Parents' Responsibilities and Right to Know

Parents' Responsibilities

Parents are expected to maintain a keen awareness in their child's lessons. Every parent should: (a) know what the student is responsible for each week; (b) supervise home practice; and (c) read all materials sent home from the school.

Parent Right to Know Policy

1. Title 1 and No Child Left Behind (NCLB) are federal laws that have specific expectations of family involvement in schools with the goal of having families as partners in their child's education. National Prep actively supports these expectations and strives to fully involve families in the school.
2. As a parent or guardian of a student at this school, you have the right to be notified of the following:
 - To request teachers' qualifications and "highly qualified" status;
 - To notification if the school is identified as in need of improvement;
 - To notice if students are taught by non-highly qualified teachers for more than 4 weeks; and
 - If any parent or guardian would like information about the qualifications of their child's teacher/s, they may contact the school for this information. In the event that our school is identified as in need of improvement or if students are taught by non-highly qualified teachers for more than 4 weeks the school will notify the family in writing.
